

MIROSLAV PANSKY

Miroslav Pansky, who died in October 2007, was artistic director and conductor of the Green Bay Symphony Orchestra for 23 years. And as creator and director of the Pamiro Opera Company during that time, he also introduced area audiences to “live” opera through full-scale, professional productions. Established in 1985, the company staged some 30 operas over a period of 20 years.

Maestro Pansky took special delight in working with the youth orchestras he organized and directed for many years as part of the Symphony program. He savored the joy of watching young talent develop, of inspiring those with special gifts to take on ever greater challenges as performers.

To honor Maestro Pansky’s contributions to the artistic life of the region and to carry forward his dedication to excellence, the Civic Symphony of Green Bay offers the Miroslav Pansky Memorial Competition as a biennial event open to young musicians of Northeast Wisconsin.

REPERTOIRE

Instrumental

Concerto movement or concert piece from the standard repertoire with published orchestral accompaniment

Vocal

Aria or comparable selection from an opera or oratorio in the standard repertoire with published orchestral accompaniment

FEE

Non-refundable \$25 entry fee payable to the Civic Symphony of Green Bay

RULES

Selection must be no longer than ten (10) minutes in duration. Appropriate cuts should be made if needed and noted on the score. All selections for audition must come from the standard repertoire and receive the approval of the orchestra conductor.

All contestants must have their own piano accompanist for the competition. No contestant will be allowed to perform without an accompanist.

All contestants must submit three copies, with measures numbered, for the judges' use at the time of the competition. Please mark any cuts and/or changes in the music.

Applications must be postmarked no later than September 24, 2010 and sent with the \$25 fee to:
